Sisterhood's Lilith Salons have been a terrific success with 45 women participating in 3 salon sessions, meeting 4 times last year. Many of you have heard the buzz and have asked to be included in the conversation so we are adding spaces for the coming year.

This program will consist of groups or salons of eight or more women who get together four times each year to discuss stimulating articles from Lilith Magazine. These salons are more free-flowing than a book club, not as spiritual as a Rosh Chodesh group, and more intimate than a lecture.

Lilith salons were created by Lilith Magazine, which has been the print "salon" for Jewish women's conversations for nearly three decades. Each salon has trigger topics taken from the latest issue of Lilith, but the conversation moves in whatever direction the participants take it: reproductive rights, interracial families, or new rituals for Jewish weddings – just to mention a few topics. The magazine is published four times annually, and the salons meet a few weeks after each publication.

Why the Lilith Salons? Jewish women's salons bring the power and pleasure of conversation back into our busy lives. Salons are a low-key way to inspire face-to-face encounters, forge new friendships, share discovery of writers and artists and re-energize us for a social action agenda.
